Road map (how it works)

Final statements (required)
Final Exam Part 2

Individuals record a 1 minute statement.

2 people at a time go outside the room to a table and chairs.

1st person is the camera operator

2nd person is speaking

change places and the 1st person speaks

When you finish your recording, you are free to go.
