

Writing a Route 66 Travel Book

- 1. Watch, listen, take notes
- 2. Research (use English websites) write (in English)
- 3. Write about / Discuss these segments
- Create headers and information for travel website

Road map (how it works)

- 1. In Class:
 - a. watch Rt. 66 video segments
 - b. take notes from video
 - i. idioms
 - ii. information about the places and the road
 - iii. interesting things you want to include in the travel book

Research, write, share ideas

2. Individuals

- a. research travel area
- b. write paragraph about this area

3. Groups discuss paragraphs

- a. main idea
- b. 3 interest points
- c. marketing (how to persuade readers to travel and experience Rt. 66)

Group process

- 4. Group writes:
 - a. headline
 - b. introduction paragraph(using marketing ideas)
 - c. "interest points" list
- 5. Groups discuss with Collins
 - a. introduction paragraphs
 - b. interest points

Each group writes 1 paragraph about each state After watching the Rt. 66 video about that state

How to make a good grade on paragraphs

- 1. Well-worded topic sentence
- 2. 3 specific supporting sentences & concluding sentence
- 3. On-topic [deals with things that are fun for young people to do along Rt. 66]

WHEN: ASAP (as soon as possible)

Videos, commercials = 10 points

- 2 Make-up days
 - 2 group videos
 Each person speaks for 1 minute
 - 2. 2 group commercials
 (about the topic of the make-up day videos)

Festival

3. 1 video about the festival Each person speaks for 1 minute

How to make a good grade on Commercials:

- 1. Contains elements of persuasion discussed in class ()
- 2. Good sequencing
- 3. Word choice
- 4. Addressed to target audience
- 5. Accuracy

Music videos (Rt. 66) = 5 points

Groups make a music video

- Rt. 66 song (composed by Bobby Troup)
 (any version of the song)
- 2. Sing the song OR lip sync
- 3. Make the video very entertaining

How to make a good grade on music videos:

- sung words must be clear
 lip sync must be able to see the people's mouths clearly pronouncing the words
- 2. Must be able to hear the song clearly (no outside or background noise)
- 3. Entertainment value (colorful, movement, facial expressions, etc.)
- 4. Students participate fully in presentation.

Rt. 66 articles (final) = 25 points

Each student

Write a 1 page article on each of your two states.

(paragraph = 5 sentences)

Paragraphs
Top sentence
3 support sentences
conclusion sentence

Must be on the topic of what <u>university age students</u> would like to do along Rt. 66 in that state

AND persuade young people to travel Rt. 66

How to make a good grade on final articles:

- 1. Clearly stated main point in the first paragraph
- 2. Paragraphs must have a topic sentence containing the main idea.
- 3. <u>Sentences</u> within the paragraphs must be related to the main idea.
- 4. Article has a strong, persuasive conclusion.

Do your own writing

(do not cut and paste from the internet)

I will edit and correct your articles for publication on the website.
